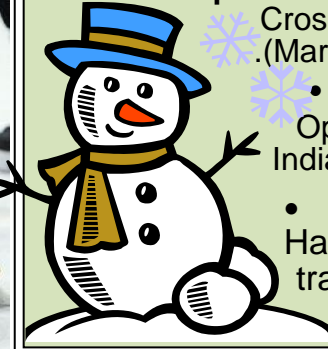

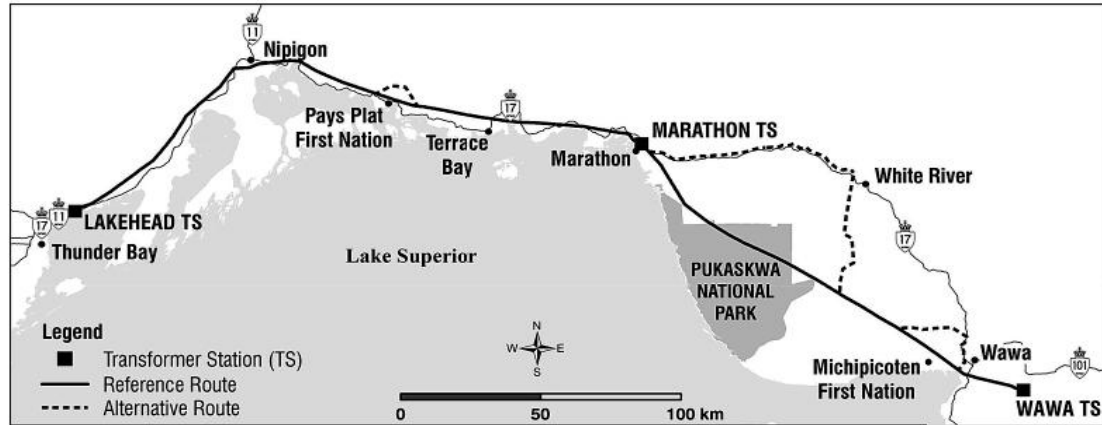

Notice of Submission of the Terms of Reference New East-West Tie Transmission Project NextBridge Infrastructure

NextBridge Infrastructure (NextBridge) – a partnership between NextEra Energy Canada, Enbridge Inc., and Borealis Infrastructure – has prepared a Terms of Reference for an Individual Environmental Assessment for the new East-West Tie Transmission Project. NextBridge is submitting the Terms of Reference to the Ministry of the Environment as required by the *Environmental Assessment Act*. As part of the submission process, the public, landowners, other stakeholders and First Nations and Métis are encouraged to review the Terms of Reference and submit comments to the Ministry of the Environment.

NextBridge proposes to construct approximately 400 km of new transmission line. The Project will consist of a double-circuit 230 kilovolt (kV) transmission line generally paralleling the existing double-circuit 230 kV transmission corridor connecting the Wawa Transformer Station (TS) to the Lakehead TS near Thunder Bay. Alternative Routes have been identified around federal lands, including two First Nation reserves and Pukaskwa National Park. The Project will also require new and improved access roads and temporary laydown and work areas. The targeted in-service date is the first half of 2018.



Project Rationale
The Ontario Power Authority (OPA), the provincial agency responsible for long-term electricity planning, identified the expansion of the transmission system between Wawa and Thunder Bay in order to maintain a reliable, long-term supply of electricity to northwestern Ontario. The East-West Tie was recommended based on forecasted electricity demand and changes to the electricity supply in the area, as well as technical, economic, and other considerations. The East-West Tie was included as a priority project in the Government of Ontario's 2010 Long Term Energy Plan. The target in-service date is the first half of 2018.

The Environmental Assessment Process
The first step in the Environmental Assessment process is the preparation of a Terms of Reference (ToR). The ToR outlines the work plan NextBridge will follow to address the requirements of the *Environmental Assessment Act*. If approved by the Minister of the Environment, the ToR will provide the framework for the second step of the process, the preparation of the Environmental Assessment (EA).

Terms of Reference Review
The proposed ToR will be available for review beginning February 28, 2014 for a period of 31 days.

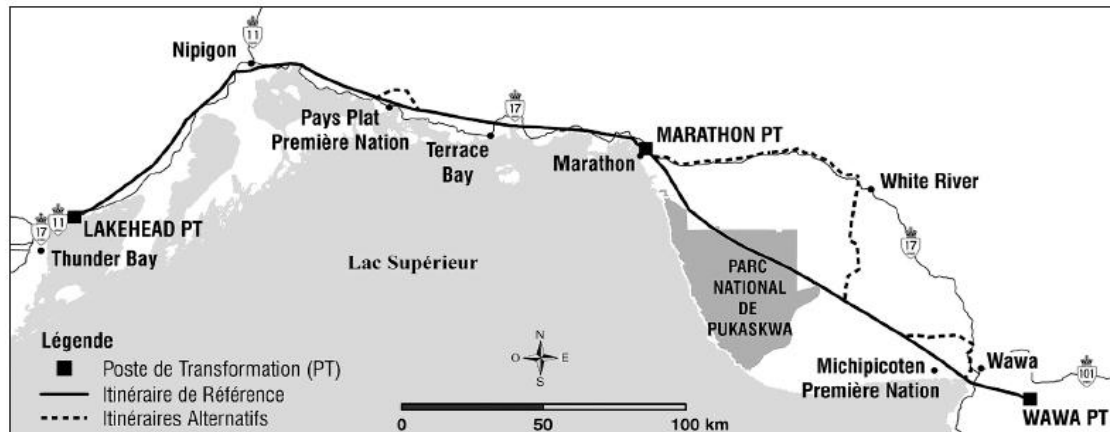

Avis de présentation du mandat Projet de transmission sur la nouvelle ligne d'interconnexion Est-Ouest NextBridge Infrastructure

NextBridge Infrastructure (NextBridge), issu d'un partenariat entre NextEra Energy Canada, Enbridge Inc. et Borealis Infrastructure, a préparé le mandat d'une évaluation environnementale individuelle pour le projet de transmission sur la nouvelle ligne d'interconnexion Est-Ouest. Conformément à la Loi sur les évaluations environnementales, NextBridge présente le mandat au ministère de l'Environnement. Dans le cadre du processus de présentation, le public, les propriétaires fonciers, les autres intervenants, ainsi que les Premières Nations et les Métis sont encouragés à examiner le mandat et à envoyer leurs commentaires au ministère de l'Environnement.

NextBridge a l'intention de construire une nouvelle ligne de transport d'environ 400 km. Le projet consistera en une ligne de transport à double circuit de 230 kilovolts qui, en général, sera comparable à la ligne de transport à double circuit de 230 kilovolts qui relie actuellement le poste de transformation de Wawa à celui de Lakehead, près de Thunder Bay. D'autres itinéraires contournant les territoires domaniaux, notamment deux réserves des Premières Nations et le parc national du Canada Pukaskwa, ont été définis. De nouvelles routes d'accès améliorées ainsi que des aires de travail et de dépôt de l'équipement seront nécessaires dans le cadre du projet. La date de mise en service prévue se situe dans le premier semestre de 2018.



Justification du projet
 Ontario Power Authority (OPA), l'organisme provincial chargé de la planification à long terme de l'électricité, a déterminé que l'expansion du système de transport d'électricité entre Wawa et Thunder Bay était nécessaire pour maintenir un approvisionnement en électricité à long terme stable vers le nord-ouest de l'Ontario. La ligne d'interconnexion Est-Ouest a été recommandée en se basant sur la demande en électricité prévue et sur les changements à l'approvisionnement en électricité dans la région, ainsi que sur des facteurs techniques, économiques et d'autre nature. La ligne d'interconnexion Est-Ouest a été incluse comme projet prioritaire dans le Plan énergétique à long terme du gouvernement de l'Ontario pour 2010. La mise en service pourrait avoir lieu lors du premier semestre de 2018.

Processus d'évaluation environnementale
 La première étape du processus d'évaluation environnementale consiste en la préparation d'un mandat. Ce dernier précise le plan de travail qui sera suivi par NextBridge pour respecter les exigences de la Loi sur les évaluations environnementales. S'il est approuvé par le ministre de l'Environnement, le mandat fournira le cadre requis pour la deuxième étape du processus, à savoir la préparation de l'évaluation environnementale (EE).

Examen du mandat
 Le mandat proposé pourra être examiné pendant une période de 31 jours, à compter du 28 février 2014.

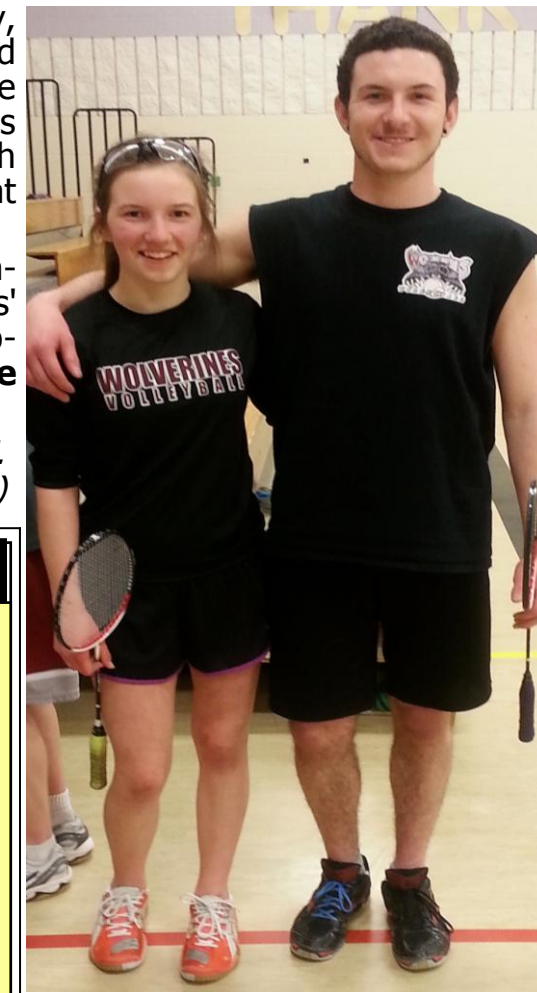
