NIPIGON, ON - 52 golfers competed at the Northshore Secondary School Athletic Association (NSSSAA) 2013-14 Golf Championships this week hosted by Nipigon Red Rock District High School at the North Shore golf Course.

Four lowest of 5 scores make up team total. Top 3 teams are advancing to NWOSSA in Geraldton next Thursday, September 26. Play was called due to weather after 14 holes so the scores below are 9-hole totals for the 4 person team, not 18 hole totals.

Marathon High School defended their title with a winning team score of 185; in second: Nipigon-Red Rock District High School with 198 and third place was claimed by Ecole Secondaire L'Orée des Bois (Dubreuilville) with 204.

Frank Desmoulins won the gold medal for lowest individual male with 38 while Krista Leach took the lowest individual female gold with 76.

## HORNEPAYNE MILL & CO-GEN PLANT OPENING

**HORNEPAYNE, ON** - With support from the Ontario government, Olav Haavaldsrud Timber Company Ltd. has opened the Becker Cogeneration Plant. This 10-megawatt facility will use sawmill wood by-products to generate electricity for the provincial power grid and produce heat for nearby sawmill and kiln operations.

"This new plant will not only have economic rewards to the community of Hornepayne, but will also change the landscape of the forest industry. We would like to thank the Ministry of Natural Resources for its commitment and dedication to this project and thank the province for its



financial support."

Supporting an innovative forest industry is part of the government's Growth Plan for Northern Ontario. A strong northern economy will help create a fair society and give the people of Ontario more opportunities for jobs and economic prosperity.

"This is a prime example of our

government's commitment to the forestry industry and to preserving and creating jobs in Northern Ontario. The opening of the Becker Cogeneration Plant represents a major turning point for the entire community of Hornepayne and will bring substantial savings to the Haavaldsrud sawmill. Our government continues to work with forestry businesses to strengthen their competitiveness and to help create long-term prosperity in Northern Ontario communities."

- Ontario's support for this project includes a conditional grant of \$11.867 million through the Forest Sector Prosperity Fund, a \$17.8-million loan guarantee through the Forest Sector Loan Guarantee Program, and \$1 million from the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation.
- The \$66-million cogeneration facility is next to existing lumber-manufacturing facilities, creating 20 new jobs, saving 100 more at a nearby mill and supporting an estimated 40 indirect jobs in collecting forest biofibre.
- Olav Haavaldsrud Timber Company Ltd. is the second-largest employer in Hornepayne.
- The plant will consume 175,000 to 200,000 tonnes of sawmill wood by-products annually.



## **INDUSTRIAL RD UPDATE: Mtwdge Councillor Delivers Petitions to Minister Gravelle**

While attending the NOMA NWO Regional Conference, Thursday, September 26<sup>th</sup>, Manitouwadge Councillor Sheldon Plummer delivered Industrial road petitions signed by approximately 700 residents of Northwestern Ontario, to MPP Michael Gravelle, Minister of Northern Development and

The petition outlined the interest, of those who signed, of having the Minister and other provincial representatives, working to establish a long-term agreement for maintenance of the road which links Manitouwadge to the Municipality of Greenstone, specifically the communities of Caramat, Hillsport and Longlac. The Industrial Road (aka Hwy 625) is no longer maintained by the MNR and, without maintenance, 2 washed out locations are not able to be crossed by regular vehicular traffic. The lack of maintenance of the road leaves Manitouwadge residents without a reliable 2<sup>nd</sup> route should Highway 614 be closed for any period of time. Hillsport residents, many of whom travel to Manitouwadge for mail pick-up, health services and access to ServiceOntario (or other government services) among other things, are also left without a reliable, well-travelled route to Manitouwadge.
