#### Manitouwadge Businesses Supporting Local Causes

**THREADS** volunteer operator Linda Gilles-Jalbert was excited to announce recently that she had new retail items available at the 2<sup>nd</sup> hand clothing and house wares shop she created to raise funds for the Manitouwadge Museum.

Louis Bérubé, Owner /Operator of **Freehawk Enterprises** (an outdoor clothing and sporting goods store) was dropping off a personal donation when he asked Jalbert if she would be interested in re-selling slightly imperfect or discontinued items from his downtown business – Jalbert jumped on the opportunity. Bérubé explained that he would normally return such items for credit from the manufacturer but that, for smaller apparel or sport accessories (like a pair of mittens which had a pulled seem which he had repaired before donating), the costs and time involved in returning the items were sometimes greater than the credit he would receive. For Jalbert new items are appealing for a number of reasons not least of which is the added traffic and interest they create for Threads. During a conversation with Jalbert, Bérubé realized she could likely also make use of some display racks he was no longer using in the store and donated those as well. "It seems like a win-win situation" was a comment reiterated by both store owners who are being mutually promoted through the arrangement while creating new community relationships.

Economic Development Assistant Karen Robinson was thrilled when **Village Pizza and Submarines** Owner/Operator Shamm Jackson approached her with an idea for a Holiday Promotion at his restaurant which will serve as a fundraiser for the Township's BizKid\$ program. Jackson first became involved with the local BizKid\$ program, which helps young entrepreneurs learn about business development and ownership, this summer when a group of participants visited his downtown restaurant.

How will the funds raised be used? EDA Karen Robinson explained to Ontario NewsNorth.com that the day camp she had offered this summer was assisted by a Local Initiative grant from Superior North CFDC and that to continue offering similar camps they would need to find alternative funding sources. "We're planning on running the program for 9-12 year olds again next year but that's just a small part of what is in development" said Robinson "I'm also looking into offering a shorter program for younger kids in 2013 – any outside contributions are much appreciated". ### 2012 Ontario Fire Season Report

*The ministry of Natural Resources released the following report following the official end of the 2012 Fire Season, October 31<sup>st</sup>.* 

The 2012 forest fire season recorded a greater number of fires compared to 2011 but with a much smaller area burned. At the end of the season, October 31<sup>st</sup>, there had been 1,611 wildfires recorded during 2012 affecting a total area of 151,181 hectares. Causes have been identified for 1,550 of these fires; 964 were caused by lightning and 586 were attributed to human causes.

On the whole, it was a more "normal" fire season despite fire activity running ahead of the ten-year averages for number of fires and hectares burned. However, there were periods of heightened activity and major fires that posed serious risks to several communities.

When fire activity was at its busiest, Ontario supplemented its own firefighting resources with personnel and aircraft from other agencies.

Firefighting staff from Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba, Minnesota, New Brunswick, Saskatchewan and Parks Canada spent 3,671 person days working in the province.

During quieter periods, Ontario assisted neighbouring states and other Canadian provinces. Personnel from Ontario spent 1,086 person days working outside the province. Ontario provided assistance to Alberta, British Columbia, Minnesota and the Northwest Territories.

Operational spending for the 2012 fire season is estimated at approximately \$159 million. This compares to approximately \$229 million that was spent in 2011. Fire season spending is highly-variable and depends on seasonal activity. Adjusting for inflation, program spending has averaged approximately \$137 million annually during the last ten years.

With the 2012 fire season completed, equipment is now being recycled and aircraft are undergoing maintenance. Fire program personnel are moving ahead with required training and upgrading in preparation for the 2013 season.
